## Endowment Fund

The purpose of the Endowment Fund is to preserve and control a permanent body of funds to provide investment revenue for the benefit of the museum. The principle itself cannot be spent.

The Endowment Fund will be managed by three Trustees, each elected for a three year term. The election shall be at the time and by the method for the election of Museum officers. Initially, the three Trustees elected will select by lot, terms of one, two, and three years each. Subsequently, one trustee will be elected each year for a three year term. To fill a vacancy prior to completion of a term, a Trustee will be appointed by the two remaining trustees. If there are two or three vacancies at one time, they will be filled by election by the museum membership according to the rules for election of Museum officers.

The vote of a majority of the Trustees will be sole and complete authorization for investing, disbursing and any other matters for which the Trustees are responsible. The Trustees shall establish and operate such financial accounts as they deem necessary.

Any funds donated to the Museum for permanent investment will be part of the Endowment Fund, whether or not the Endowment Fund is specified by the donor.

The Endowment Fund will not accept funds restricted in use beyond the restrictions in this document.

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## Hartford Track Removal Project

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (CDOT) gave CERM two sections of abandoned track located in Rocky Hill and the south end of Hartford, CT. The Rocky Hill section was removed rapidly completed earlier this spring. Now that cooler weather has returned we must turn our attention to the Hartford project. Unlike Rocky Hill the access to this work area is difficult and trees are growing up through the tracks. However, we do expect to recover approximately 3000 linear feet of rail including a switch.

Directions to the site from Willimantic – Follow Route 6 to I 384 and then get on I 84. Watch for the Charter Oak Bridge and stay on Route 5 & 15. Don't get onto I 91 South! Take exit 87 which will take you to Brainard Road. The Chowder Pot II restaurant will be on your right. International Truck Sales will be on Brainard Road. Turn left onto Brainard Road, preparing for a left turn at the next traffic light. Turn left onto Airport Road. Go under the I 91 and railroad bridge to the next traffic light. This is Locust St. Turn right here and continue past the UPS Terminal (on right). Continue to stop sign and turn right onto Wawarme Ave. Go past Penske, CT Transit, and State Office Building, all on right. Safely park near the railroad crossing, where ever you can and walk to the right along the railroad tracks. I 91 will be on your left. Follow the chain link fence on your right. Our work site starts where the chain link fence meets the woods.

We anticipate starting work around mid-October. For questions please call Adrian Atkins – residence 860-423-5930 or his cell 860-377-6433. Please come and join us on this new adventure which will provide the museum with more track for the museum.


